Lifetime Movies directed by Nicole L. Thompson:

- Suitcase Killer: The Melanie McGuire Story (2022) This true-crime drama delves into the chilling case of Melanie McGuire, a New Jersey nurse convicted of murdering her husband and disposing of his body in suitcases. The film premiered on Lifetime as part of their "Ripped from the Headlines" series.
- You're Not Supposed to Be Here (2023) A suspenseful thriller that explores themes of identity and belonging, this film was nominated for a GLAAD Media Award, highlighting its impactful storytelling and representation.

Additionally, Thompson contributed as the Second Unit Director for *Envy: A Seven Deadly Sins Story* (2021), Lifetime's anthology inspired by the seven deadly sins.

workshop overview

This masterclass focused on understanding the audition process from the director's point of view. Participants explored how to:

- Convey emotional range authentically
- Use silence and stillness as powerful tools
- React and listen actively
- Express subtext through eyework and body language
- Take direction with flexibility and intention
- Deliver adjustments quickly and effectively



What directors are really looking for

- Authenticity over perfection
- Ability to stay present and connected
- Confidence, even in silence
- Respect for direction and collaboration

Tools for stronger auditions

- Scene analysis: Break down the script to understand objectives, stakes and beats
- Subtext mastery: Learn to communicate with what isn't said use your eyes, breath and physicality
- Emotional recall: Tap into personal experiences to enrich your performance
- Improvisation: Be ready to adapt quickly and make bold choices

In-the-room skills

- First impressions: The moment you walk into the room, you're auditioning. Bring grounded, open energy
- Slating tips: Be clear, concise and personable
- Taking direction: Directors want to see how you adjust. Listen closely, process quickly and shift with purpose

Exercises to Practice

- Mirror work: Practice emotional shifts and subtle eye movement in front of a mirror
- Scene rehearsal: Record yourself performing a scene and review your reactions and use of silence
- Director's challenge: Have a friend give you different directions mid-scene and practice adjusting naturally

Be brave enough to make strong choices. Even if it's not the final choice, **it tells me who you are as an artist**."
